### **New Technology to Clean Water**

A new technique has been developed that uses graphene oxide sheets to transform dirty water into drinking water. This new approach combines bacteria-produced cellulose and graphene oxide to form a bi-layered biofoam. A paper detailing the research is available online in [Advanced Materials](#).
