DEC Surveys Endangered Mussel Population in Western NY

In early September, DEC Region 9 staff surveyed Cassadaga Creek for the federally and NYS-endangered [clubshell mussel](#) (*Pleurobema clava*). DEC staff had stocked the mussels in 2015 and 2016 as part of a project with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission to bolster the population in western New York. The survey turned up 175 tagged mussels and revealed a preliminary survival rate of 50-75%.

Tips for the Environment

1. **Reduce Food Waste at Thanksgiving**- Think green beyond the green bean casserole. If you dread days of turkey sandwiches, consider freezing leftovers or resizing your cooking plans. Americans waste approximately 30-40% of our food; this contributes to our climate change problem and degradation of our natural resources. 2. **Vote on Election Day**-Educate yourself on the issues. We will be voting on an environmental proposition #3. The proposed amendment will create a land account with up to 250 acres of forest preserve land eligible for use by towns, villages, and counties that have no viable alternative to using forest preserve land to address specific public health and safety concerns; as a substitute for the land removed from the forest preserve, another 250 acres of land, subject to legislative approval, will be added to the forest preserve. The proposed amendment also will allow bicycle trails and certain public utility lines to be located within the width of highways that traverse the forest preserve while minimizing removal of trees and vegetation. Yes to approve amendment, no for against the amendment.
3. **Single Use Plastic Bags**- These bags have a large environmental impact from their production for limited use to their contribution to litter and plastic pollution in our waterways. You can spread the word through social media by snapping a picture the next time you see a bag littered in your community and sharing it with #ErieBYOBag.
